

Young Shipwrights Programme 2015

Excursions and practical workshops with shipwrights and business volunteers

- Hosted by Engine Shed at Temple Meads Station and on boat and foot
 - Workshops for 30 or 60 children each day
 - Flexible times to suit schools travel and end of day
 - Dates in June and July
 - Alternatively host the workshop at your school
 - Workshops for up to 90 children each day
 - Dates in April to July
1. Explore the Floating Harbour by ferry boat
 2. Explore lock gates and sluices and meet the boat builders, riggers, blacksmiths and other businesses on the quay side including the sailing school
 3. Build model boats in the Engine Shed, Temple Meads (A Business Innovation Centre and home to Brunel's historic board room)
- Engages children in heritage learning in a practical way that helps them express their cultural identity in relation to their city
 - Tailored to suit needs of pupils and curriculum
 - Engages business and industry volunteers with your school in a fun activity with pupils to explore skills needed for success and happiness and to raise aspirations
 - Encourages families to celebrate their child's learning
 - Put children's engineering and creativity centre stage at the Bristol Harbour Festival.

Family event -12 noon on Saturday 18th July the Boats sail to open the Bristol Harbour Festival. £100 going to the winning sail boat and the winner's trophy for the school. Followed by the adult cardboard boat race and the Festival. Attendance at this event is entirely optional.

Over 2700 children have taken part over the last 3 years with over 10,000 spectators watching the race



Costs - Business partners are available for schools. The business reduces the cost for schools to £225 per workshop (30 pupils) and £400 (60 pupils)
